P.Art, a Public Art Project, 2012

A public art project in which 15 people agreed to participate in the remaking of their personal items into floral garlands. The locations were divulged only to the participants and left up for 30 days. A community project with the Horace Mann elementary school where children will make wishes from recycled paper. The papers will be made into a paper chain which will be displayed at the school.
